Liturgical Colors for Advent

A reformed view of worship involves all the senses. Churches often use various means to aid our worship through the senses. One such means is the use of color and light. The parament coverings on the pulpit and communion table reflect the liturgical calendar through color. Today, the first Sunday of Advent, marks the beginning of a new liturgical year. The color purple is used during Advent. Purple, which symbolizes penitence, is also used during Lent.


