Confession of God's People

In the Confession of Sin we humbly agree with Scripture's claim that

all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. This is the most honest moment of our week, as we confess our sin and shame together. We do this corporately through

a unison litany or prayer and individually through a moment of silence for private confession.

Repentance of God's People Our time of confession becomes a

time of fresh commitment through corporate repentance. Together we boldly turn from all evil and offer our lives again to God. Only say these words if you are indeed willing to repent of your sins.

### Assurance of God's Pardon Confession and repentance is alwavs met with the surety of God's

grace. The minister proclaims to the penitent community words of pardon from Scripture, assuring our hearts of the grace that is already ours in Christ Jesus.

Greeting of Peace We extend to others the grace that God has extended to us, greeting each other with the peace of Christ. In the midst of a fractured world filled with prejudice, hatred, and violence, we are a demonstration of God's reconciliation. Worship-

ers greeted one another with the words of Christ after His resurrection, which became the customary greeting of the early Church: "Peace be with vou."


### Confession of Faith The Apostles Creed
